LGSEC Subcommittees

The LGSEC is creating several subcommittees to support LGSEC's 2013 priority areas. These subcommittees include:

- Energy Efficiency
- Cap and Trade
- Renewables
- Fundraising/Business Development

Key Responsibilities for Subcommittee Members

- Draft policy guidelines/develop white papers on committee topic area.
- Participate in proceedings relevant to the committee issue.
- Work with Jody on filings relevant to the committee issue.
- Be responsible for providing comments on decisions.

Subcommittee Guidelines

- Each Subcommittee will consist of no more than 5 members, chosen on a first come, first serve basis.
- LGSEC Members can serve on up to 3 different committees.
- Each Subcommittee will have a LGSEC Board liaison.
- The entire membership will have a chance to weigh in on each Subcommittee's white paper.

Energy Efficiency Subcommittee

The LGSEC Energy Efficiency Subcommittee will engage in key state actions (legislation, hearings, proceedings) around local government energy efficiency issues. Key priorities for 2013 include:

- Program Design
- RENs During the 2015 Cycle
- Shareholder Incentives
- Cost Effectiveness
- CPUC Research Studies
- Energy Usage Data

Note: This subgroup will need to identify a point person that is willing to decide when comments are ready for submittal.

Cap and Trade Subcommittee

The LGSEC Climate Change Subcommittee will engage in key state actions (legislation, hearings, proceedings) around local government climate change issues. Key priorities for 2013 include:

- Cap and Trade (CPUC proceedings, CARB auctions, AB 1532, and SB 52)
- o Prop 39

Renewables Subcommittee

The LGSEC Renewables Subcommittee will engage in key state actions (legislation, hearings, proceedings) around local government renewable energy issues. Key priorities for 2013 include:

- Financing public sector projects
- Increasing deployment of distributed generation projects
- Ongoing support for residential and commercial solar
- Facilitating community solar programs and projects
- O Developing a meaningful feed-in tariff
- Facilitating development of micro-grids

Fundraising/Business Development Subcommittee

The fundraising and business development subcommittee will assist the organization in ensuring that it has the resources needed to accomplish the LGSEC mission and strategic plan. Key priorities for 2013 include:

- O Working with staff to establish a fundraising *plan* that incorporates a series of appropriate vehicles, such as special events, direct mail, foundation proposals, etc.
- Working with fundraising staff in their efforts to raise money
- Taking the lead in certain types of outreach efforts, such as chairing special events, etc.
- O Being responsible for involvement of all board members in fundraising, such as having board members make telephone calls to ask for support, and
- Monitoring fundraising efforts to be sure that ethical practices are in place, that donors are acknowledged appropriately, and that fundraising efforts are costeffective.
