RE: Local Government Sustainable Energy Coalition Priorities for CPUC Programs

Dear President Peevey:

Thank you for the invitation to identify the top priorities of the Local Government Sustainable Energy Coalition<sup>1</sup> ("LGSEC") in regards to energy and sustainability programs under the jurisdiction of the California Public Utilities Commission ("CPUC"). We appreciate your offer to convene a half-day working session in the near future with senior utility executives in Southern California to discuss and develop solutions to these issues.

At the meeting, we would appreciate an opportunity for our elected delegation to brief the utility executives on local government capabilities and interests, as we were able to do with you. A discussion of the priorities identified below should flow from that presentation.

- Local governments can be a full, equal partner in designing and implementing Statesponsored energy and climate change programs that rely on local governments, for example, energy efficiency, small renewable deployment, climate action plans. This will allow better integration between efficiency and renewable energy programs at the State level to better support the comprehensive and integrated approaches that local governments are implementing within their own communities.
- Refashion local government energy efficiency partnerships to maximize local government expertise and mission.

Thank you very much for your attention to this matter. We appreciate the opportunity that you have created through Chief ALJ's Clopton's focus groups later this week to express some of our concerns about CPUC process, and look forward to participating in that venue. Also, we are happy to help with logistics for the meeting in Southern California. I look forward to working with you and your staff to enhance the relationship of local governments with CPUC decision makers and staff, and with the investor-owned utilities.
